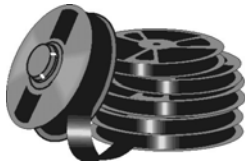

Based in New York, Divine Performing Arts is distinguished by its conscious effort to remain independent of China's communist regime, which

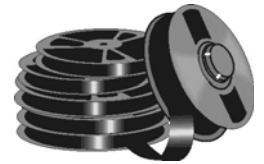
